

The City Council met 02 Oct 2023 at the Shelly City Hall. Assistant Mayor George Swenson presided. Council members present were Thomas Keeney Jr., and Gene Dybing. Also, presents were David Swenson, Jonithan Meyer, Todd Westcott, Joe Iancello, Catherine Shelley, Sue Holmgren, and Mark Dohman. Mayor Cakebread and Council member Swalstad were not in attendance.

The council meeting was called to order at 07:00 P.M.

Assistant Mayor George Swenson opened the meeting.

A Motion was made by Dybing and seconded by Keeney to accept the minutes of Sept 11, 2023, city council meeting. Motion carried

The council discussed Railroad Management's email.

Delinquent bills were reviewed and discussed.

A Motion was made by Dybing and seconded by Keeney to pay the bills. Motion carried

A Motion was made by Keeney and seconded by Dybing to approve proving a free lot to Catherine Shelley to put a house on. Motion carried

A Motion was made by Dybing and seconded by Keeney to approve Todd Westcott's hunting party to cross over Shelly's dump to private lands to hunt. Motion carried

A Motion was made by Keeney and seconded by Dybing approve buying a new water meter reader. Motion carried

The council discussed the power request for 109 Second Street.

Dohman's report stated: Total power delivered to the city for Aug was 116,156 kwh. Fall clean-up is 17 Oct 23 and brush pick-up is 03 Oct 2023. Received fire contract from Good Hope.


Jonithan's report stated: The monthly water usage for September was a total of 495,600 gallons with a daily average of 16,500 gallons per day.

The monthly wastewater that was pumped out to the ponds was 470,000 gallons with a daily average of 15,000 gallons per day.

The monthly peak of 294KW occurred on the 4th at 5:30pm.

**Jonithan also reported for September: Quarterly lift station samples taken. Replaced battery for the lift station generator. Operated all gate valves. Flushed hydrants and pumped (one needs repair). Removed flags/banners and stored them for the season. Winterized and closed up the park facilities. Zavorals repaired the damaged culvert on the north side of the city. Replaced center spindle hub on deck of batwing mower. Finished digging out tower footings, drilled pins and set forms for concrete.**
